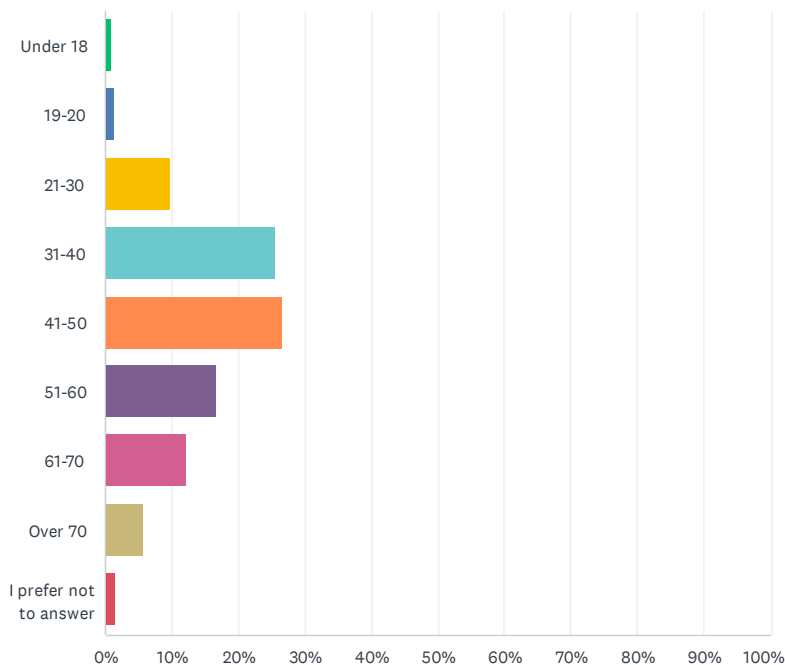


Q1 Which age category best describes you?

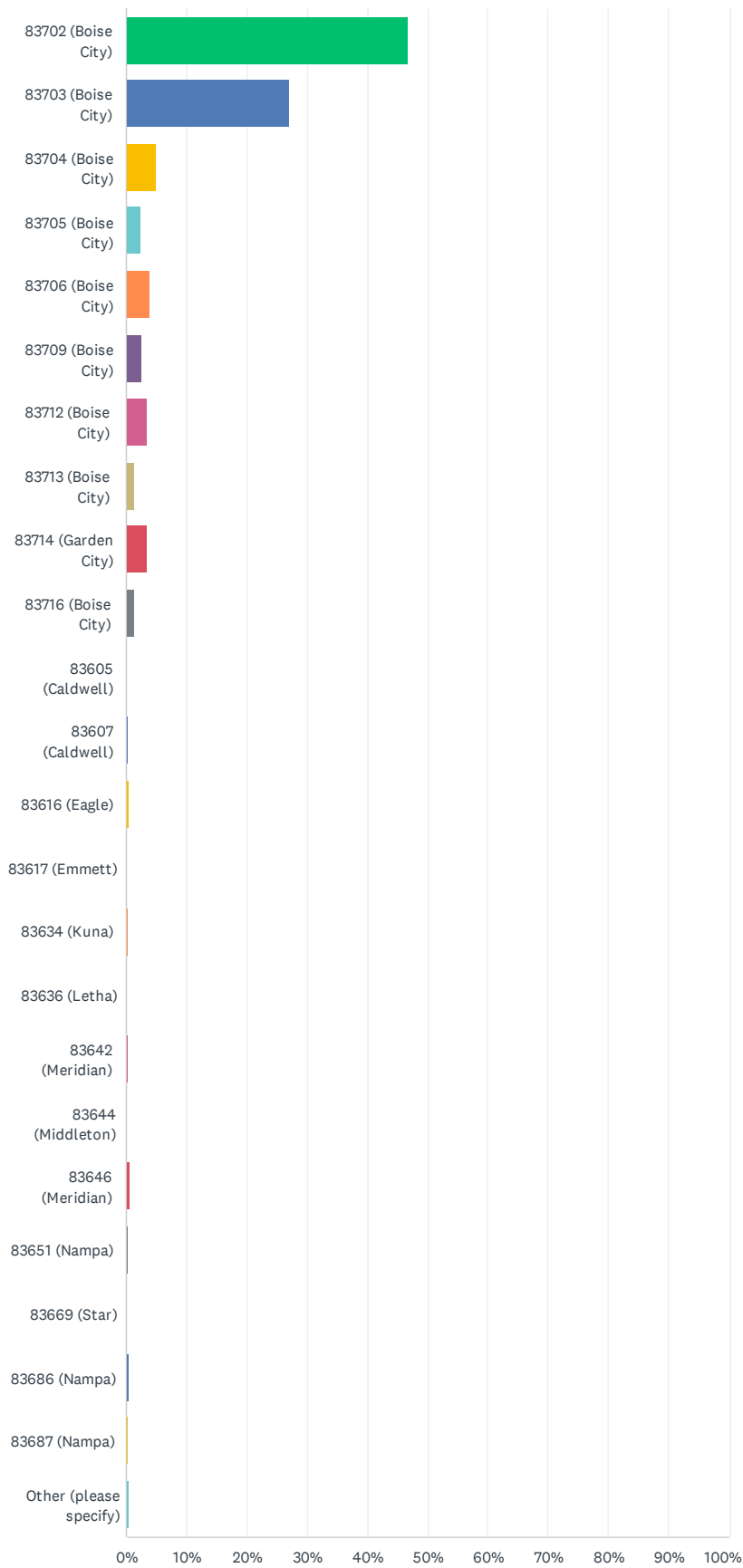

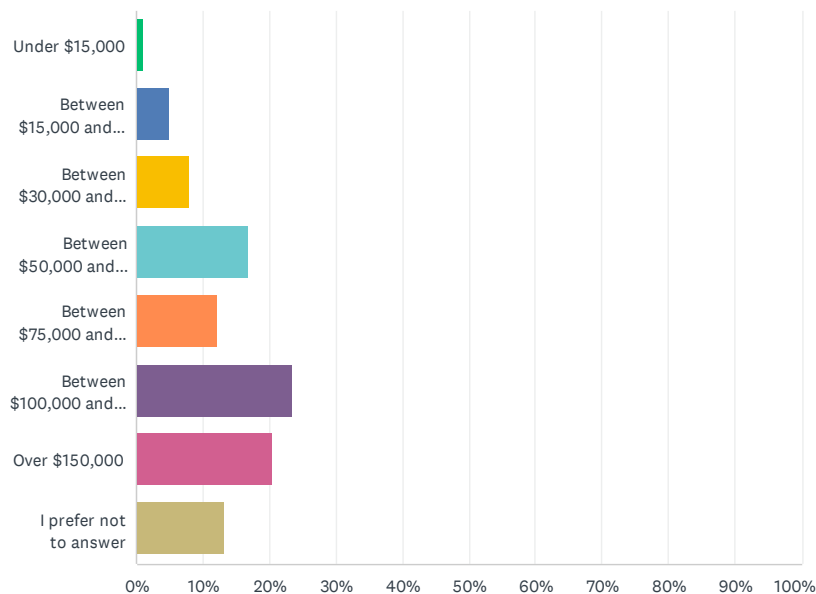

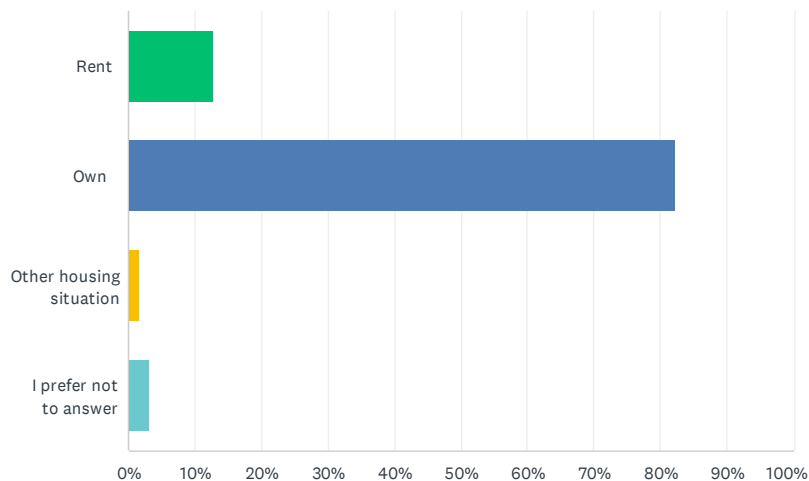

Q5 Do you rent or own your home?

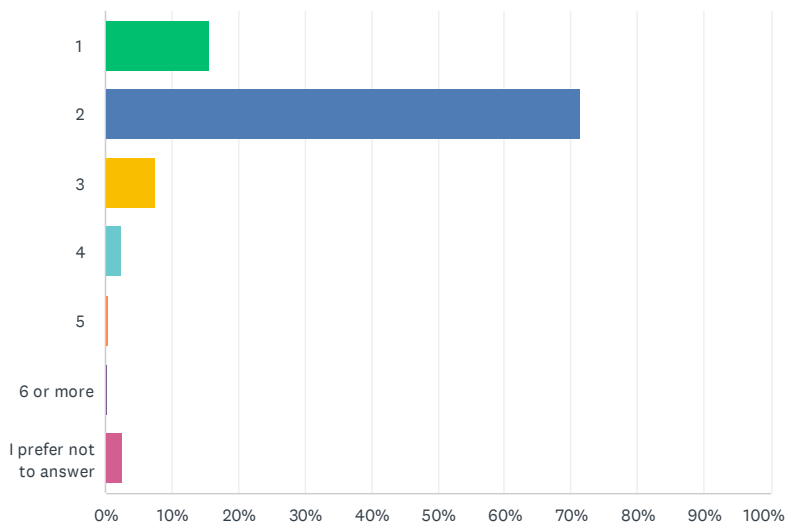

Q6 How many adults (18 years of age or older) live in your household?

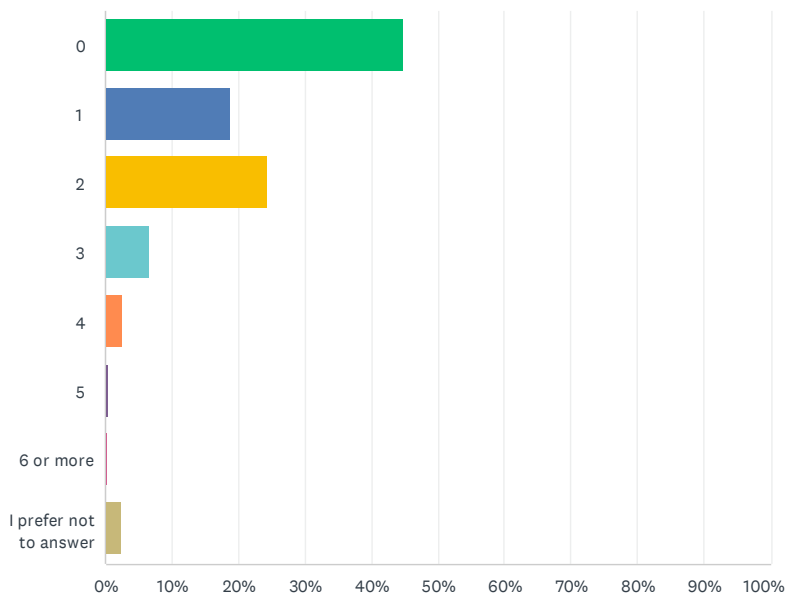

Q7 How many children (under 18 years old) live in your household?

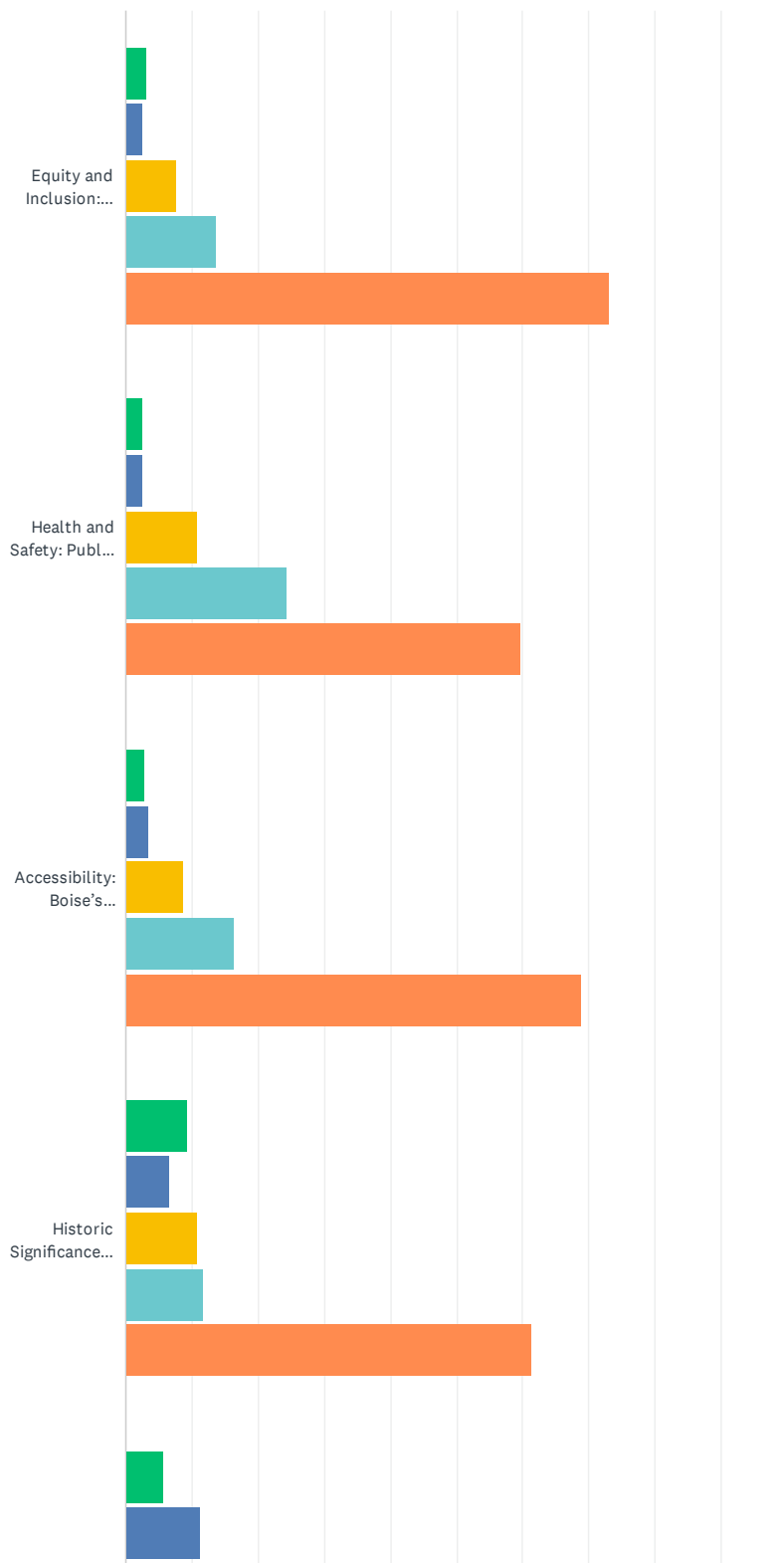

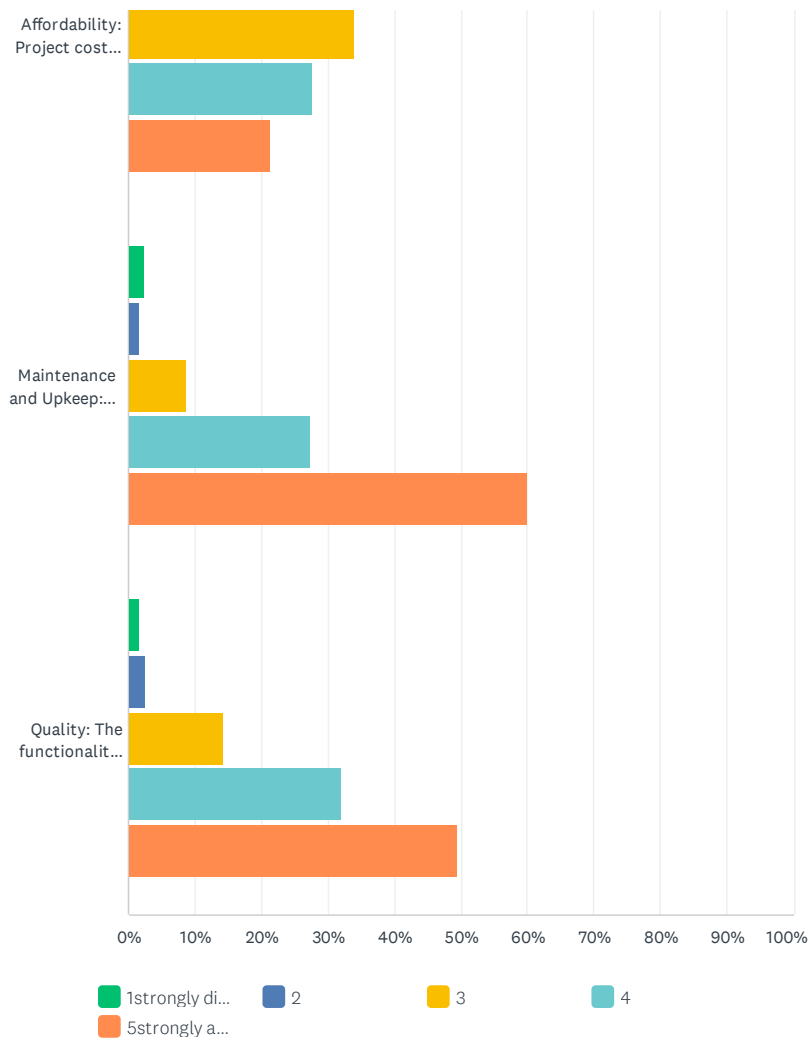

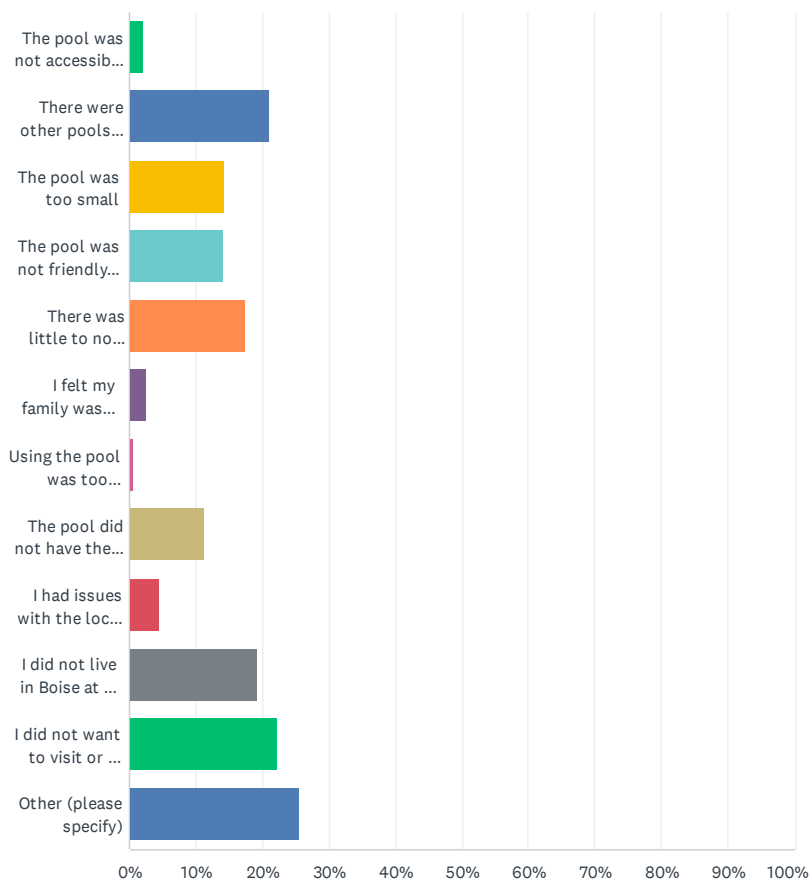
