




SNOWSHOEING & HOT SPRING ADVENTURE



SCRIP TAXI PROGRAM is a subsidized taxi program available to those age 15 years and older who have a permanent disability which inhibits their ability to drive a vehicle. Those who wish to utilize this service must live within the Boise City Limits and they will receive a 50% discount on taxi services to help meet their transportation needs. Participants must first acquire a Scrip ID card which can be obtained at the Dick Eardley Senior Center, 690 Robbins Rd. After obtaining the ID card, the participant may purchase the Scrip vouchers.
